In 2012, She served as a flight engineer on Expedition 32 and then commander of Expedition 33. In 2024, She returned to ISS on the Boeing Crew Flight Test, the first crewed mission of the Boeing Starliner, her return to earth has been delayed until March 2025 at the earliest. As such, from August 2024 until March 2025, Williams and fellow astronaut batch will more are pivoting ahead to undertake various scientific experiment and maintenance tasks aboard the International space station.
